## Content

This unit explores what it means for leaders of migrant, culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) faith communities in Australia, to minister to young people. Students will explore a range of frameworks for contextualisation, drawing from a breadth of local and global Asian and Pasifika scholarship. Students will be equipped to develop contextual theological responses to local challenges.

## Learning Outcomes

- Discuss intercultural issues in leadership, mission and ministry as they relate to discipling young people in CALD migrant contexts.
- Analyse the strengths of and challenges faced by young people in CALD migrant communities.
- Apply models of contextual analysis to a local faith community
- Develop contextual theological responses to local challenges faced by CALD migrant communities.

This is an intensive subject, over 5 days from Tuesday to Saturday, October 1-5. Lectures will be delivered in the Whitley Classroom at St Paschal Precinct, 90 Albion Rd Box Hill North. The Symposium will be at Syndal Baptist Church in Glen Waverly.
